- Trash can placement legislation a step back from beautification, HOAs, some people like to live in an area with an HOA, some don't, pride in the Village, home, neighborhoods, complaint from cans in front of the garage, approved changes, more complaints, changed again, money to beautify the Village, detracts from the Village, represent everyone in the Village, some HOA members opposed to the amendments, Ordinance enforces for HOAs, some people don't have the availability to put cans out of the line of sight, cost, uniform cans was a step to beautify the Village, rule is cumbersome for staff to enforce
- Feedback to not allow chickens, enforcement, BZA previously denied, feedback people do want chickens, other communities haven't had zoning issues with chickens, talked to 50 people that don't want chickens, going to be a huge problem, dogs gotten loose and returned, Perrysburg legislation, less of an issue with a larger population, few people - Pickleball, handicap swing, spoken to many that desire chickens
